REPUBLIC PICTURES ACQUIRES DOCUMENTARY MIGHTY MARY

Narrated by Elizabeth Banks and Hugh Jackman, a New Documentary from Award-Winning Filmmaker and Olympian Mary Mazzio in Partnership with Skydance Sports Premieres at Nantucket Film Festival June 18 with a Theatrical Launch Across the Country Starting September 11

(LOS ANGELES, CA) Republic Pictures has acquired MIGHTY MARY, the inspiring new documentary from award-winning filmmaker and Olympian Mary Mazzio in partnership

with Skydance Sports, chronicling the groundbreaking first all-women's sailing team to compete for the America's Cup, one of the most elite and exclusive events in international sports.

MIGHTY MARY will make its official debut on June 18 at the Nantucket Film Festival with a special attendance from many of the sailors including Olympians, Round-the-World Sailors and World Champions: Amy Baltzell, Merritt Carey, Sarah Cavanagh, Annie Gardner, Suzette Hau'oli Smith Gurtler, Merritt Palm Keffer, Diana Klybert, Suzy Leech, Linda Lindquist, Marci Porter Lucier, Lisa Charles McDonald, Joan Touchette Porter and Hannah Swett. The documentary will be released theatrically with AMC Theatres beginning September 11, 2026, in several major markets including New York, Los Angeles, Boston, Seattle, Chicago, Washington DC, Miami, Detroit, San Diego, Atlanta, San Francisco, Annapolis, Oklahoma City, and Traverse City (MI). Produced by Grant Hill (Atlanta Hawks owner and NBA All-Star), Allison Abner (writer for *Narcos*, *The West Wing* and *Imperfect Women*) and Mazzio alongside Skydance Sports, the documentary is narrated and executive produced by Elizabeth Banks and Hugh Jackman.

Widely dismissed at the time as a publicity stunt, the women of "*Mighty Mary*" defied expectations to become legitimate contenders in one of the most demanding competitions in sports. What began with an open call advertisement in *The New York Times* evolved into a team of world-class and Olympic athletes including Olympic sailors, Olympic rowers, a Native Hawaiian sailor, and trailblazing women athletes from across the country who challenged the deeply entrenched culture of professional sailing.

The film follows the team's remarkable journey as they stunned the sailing world by defeating *Stars & Stripes*, helmed by four-time America's Cup winner Dennis Conner, before a controversial backroom decision upended that outcome.

At its core, MIGHTY MARY is an underdog story about resilience, teamwork, leadership and redefining what is possible in spaces that historically excluded women. The documentary also explores the broader cultural impact of the team and the lasting conversations around inclusion, opportunity and leadership in sports.

"Some stories demand to be told — and MIGHTY MARY is one of them. We are honored to partner with Mary Mazzio, Allison Abner, Grant Hill and Skydance Sports in bringing this film to audiences," said Sejin Croninger, Executive Vice President of Worldwide Acquisitions, Paramount Pictures. "It is at once a breathtaking sports documentary and a testament to the women who refused to let the boundaries of their sport define them."

MIGHTY MARY is directed by Mazzio and written by Abner and Mazzio. The film is produced by Abner, Hill and Mazzio and executive produced by Banks, Jackman, Arthur M. Blank, Hill, Tamia Hill, Sue Wagner, Bryan White, Christine White, Bill Hudson, Laurie M. Tisch, John H. Carlson, Bill McNabb, Katie McNabb, Bruce Herring, Tricia Herring, Dori Walton and Bill Walton, Skydance Sports’ Jesse Sisgold, Jason Reed, Jon Weinbach, Lauren Gaffney along with Alexis Garcia and Abner. Original score is by Grammy-winning producer Shep Crawford. The film is edited by Kyle Farmer, Mary Mazzio and Shondra Burke, with cinematography by Peter Levy and Patrick Ruth.
